The rain may have briefly stopped. **Recovery continues.**

ARROW Utilities is the regional wastewater commission serving 13 member municipalities and more than 400,000 residents and businesses across the Edmonton Region.

MAY 31-JUNE 2 SIGNIFICANT RAINFALL ACROSS THE REGION.

After ~78mm of rain, regional wastewater flows increased from a typical 70–80 million litres per day to nearly 240 million litres per day.

JUNE 20-22 SECOND AND LARGER RAINFALL EVENT.

The region experienced ~106mm of rain. Exceptionally high volumes of rainwater and groundwater moved through municipal and regional systems. Massive accumulations of debris created blockages at the plant hindering operations, and bypasses occurred at 3 pump stations.

LOOKING AHEAD EVEN IF RAIN HAS STOPPED. THE WATER HASN'T.

Groundwater and rainwater continue entering wastewater systems across the region at volumes impacting recovery. Forecast for the coming days is for rainfall of more than 30mm.



ARROW's wastewater system connects multiple communities through one regional network.



Even when conditions appear normal at home, elevated groundwater and wastewater flows may still be affecting other parts of the region.



Every litre conserved helps create capacity, reduce system pressure, and support recovery across the entire regional system.
